THE RECTOR'S WHATNOT: Light of the World The Rev. Fr. Kelly Marshall

And Advent comes again. Week by week in our homes and at the Crossing we light candles. What's that wise old proverb? *"Better to light a candle than to curse the darkness."* Darkness and Light. What a rich pair of images, with roots deep in our culture's past. The reality of light and darkness paces our days and nights as well as our moral sensibilities. Each human being makes choices, when it comes to Darkness and Light.

In the Northern Hemisphere, light and darkness also have set the pattern for our holy seasons of Advent, Christmas and Epiphany. The connecting theme is Light. In the next weeks, we move hour by hour toward the year's shortest day. For the observant, that day has come and gone by December 25. The light is returning, moment by moment. When Christmas has run its course of Twelve Days, we celebrate Epiphany (January 6)—and its great sign is a Star. Little by little, daylight is returning. Because of when Easter falls in 2011, our season of Epiphany is nearly as long as it ever can be. Light returns. By the time Lent begins, Daylight Savings Time is a mere four days away.

I'm not surprised that our Christian ancestors tied the progression of the Church's Year to the waxing and waning of daylight in our hemisphere. For every day—the first song in our Hymnal: *"Father, we praise thee, now the night is over..."* For Advent: *"The King shall come when morning dawns and light triumphant breaks..."* For Christmas: *"Break forth, O beauteous heavenly light, and usher in the morning..."* (If you don't know that Christmas hymn, check out its powerful message—Hymn 91). And for Epiphany: *"Brightest and best of the stars of the morning, dawn on our darkness . . ."*

Then there's the collect for Advent's First Sunday: *"Give us grace to cast away the works of darkness, and put on the armor of light..."* I encourage each of you to spend some quality, quiet time during these first days of Advent, thinking about light and darkness. If you've not done so already, it's not too late to craft an Advent Wreath for your home. Light the candles. Say your prayers. Read your Bible. Consider the power of Jesus saying, "I am the Light of the world." And the energy of his follow-up desire: "You are the lights of the world."

Let your light so shine, that all may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven. A blessed Advent to all!

COUGHLIN'S LOG

The Rev. Christopher Zeke Coughlin

In everyday life, God's presence in our lives can be easily forgotten or overlooked. Even while sitting in the pews on a Sunday morning, it's easy to be distracted by the worries we've carried in with us. This is the reason we keep a quiet time before the Sunday service. A brief period of silence before worship allows us to put those worries aside and look toward God, who is the solution to those worries. Silence allows us to quiet the voices of our anxieties, fears, and desires so that we may hear the voice of the Lord.

In short, silence is the practice of being still and knowing God. We use a period of silence for this purpose before the Sunday service and before many of our meetings at the church, but it is my sincere hope that you can take this practice out of the church building and into your lives. A quiet time may be helpful and rewarding before each meal, before each endeavor you undertake, or anytime you feel scared or overwhelmed. Silence your mind and then fill that silence with prayer, or simply sit in the presence of God. Remember that God is always present with you and that he stands with you in times of joy and in times of sadness.

In the weeks to come, you'll be hearing a bit more about silence. We'll be distributing information with concrete examples of how to use silence in ways that are helpful to deepening your faith. In the meantime, take an opportunity to silence your mind, open your heart, be still and know God.

THIS, I BELIEVE

I believe that God really walks with us, every step of the way, throughout our day. As long as we are open to him, and listen to be in tune to his guidance, we will see he is helping us as we do his work and try to follow the teachings of Jesus.

He, of course, may help with a decision when we actively pray for help with that, but I feel he guides me almost moment by moment through the paths I take before I have time to stop and consciously pray about something. I feel he helps me to know when I need to slow down and spend a little extra time with someone, or when I need to stop and offer someone help. I feel God must be letting me know the right situations in which I should get involved, as I've never ended up being unsafe. Feeling that God is working with me helps me to remember that dictum to see Christ in all persons, and to try to be a little more patient than I might otherwise be. I believe my intuition is something God-given, as there is certainly something more than knowledge, luck, and chance helping me in my work.

Knowing God is here with me gives a calmness, purpose and direction to the day. Sometimes when things get unusually busy and hectic, without realizing it my focus will shift from God to just getting the work done, and I end up stressed and self-absorbed. When I catch myself at this and redirect the focus back to God and others, the stress resolves. When something is really out of my control, I find that it's best to let that go and give it over to God. This is something I'm still working on learning to do.

Realizing God is here protecting me, giving me strength, and helping me with choices keeps me grounded and positive about doing the work he has given me to do. Every step is easier knowing God is here beside me!

On Sunday, January 16, the parish family will gather for its Annual Meeting. A primary task of this meeting is the election of a new class of Vestry Members. **A Nominating Team is in place, and its members are Kurt Hilderbrand, Bob Maruschak and Liz Myer.**

They will bring to the Vestry a slate of *qualified and willing* nominees. To qualify for election to the Vestry, one must be a Member in Good Standing of the parish. That is canonical wording which means that a Vestry member must be a baptized, communicant and active member of the parish—one who supports the mission of the congregation with her/his gifts of *presence, time, talent, energy and money*. In addition, a Vestry member must be willing to lead or serve as primary contact with one of the ministry areas of our congregational life. S/he must be able to attend Vestry meetings and leadership days and to share in representing of our parish to the Mission Area and Diocese.

Are you called to this ministry? Please share your willingness to serve with one of the members of the Nominating Team. Do you have a qualified member in mind? Then please share his or her name with the Nominating Team. **PLEASE do not approach members on your own and ask if they want to serve.** This is the purpose and function of the Nominating Team. You nominate qualified persons by suggesting their name to the Team. Nominations may also be made on the floor of the Annual Meeting, if the individual you nominate qualifies (see above) and is willing to serve. This last means that you have received her/his permission before the meeting to place the name in nomination. ☺

Matthew 5:1-12 tells us of Jesus' famous Sermon on the Mount where Jesus spoke in front of the great crowds that followed him and he gave them what we now know as the "Beattitudes" – "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of Heaven, Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted..." We learn the beatitudes in song today, *Blessed are They*, by Jack Loble White.

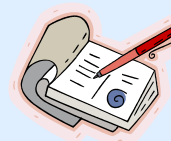

An Advent Study Led by Deacon Zeke Coughlin

As we prepare for the celebration of the birth of Jesus, we pray to deepen our relationships with the Jesus Christ who still lives today.
