## The Rector's Whatnot: Easter to Pentecost and Beyond Father Kelly Marshall

I'm writing this reflection during the Great Fifty Days—the days of celebrating resurrection and awaiting the Pentecost Festival. On that day (May 23 this year) we mark the day in which God the Holy Spirit was poured into the lives of Jesus' friends, who were waiting, waiting to know what should happen next. Sometimes we call it the birthday of the Church.

We miss the point big time, however, if we think it's the official beginning of an Institution. *Pentecost marks the day in which God the Spirit gifted Jesus' followers with what it would take to continue Jesus' vision and ministry.* We name them, generically, "the gifts of the Spirit." Paul, the Church's great visionary, thinker and missionary, got specific in First Corinthians 12 and 13:

"To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses . . . Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers; then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret? *But strive for the greater gifts.* And I will show you a still more excellent way. If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal . . . And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love."

The weeks of Easter which fall in the month of May this year bring us the chance to think about and explore the gifts which God has given each of us, so that we can continue Jesus' vision and ministry in our time and place. **We all will have a chance on Pentecost to make a fresh commitment of our time, our talents and our energy to the mission of St. James' Church.** As we wait and wait to know what should happen next in the life of our parish family, let's each consider prayerfully what gifts God has given us, and how we can use our energy, our talents and our time to share Easter's good news that Christ is alive—in us.

*Alleluia! Christ is Risen!*

## UPCOMING SABBATICAL



As you may or may not know, our Rector is due for a sabbatical within the next several months. What is a sabbatical? It's a period of extended leave time from work for the purpose of rest, refreshment, often travel, and learning or achieving some goal. The word has the same origin as the word Sabbath, and refers to a rest or ceasing. There are many references to this concept in the Bible, such as one in Leviticus, in which there is a commandment to desist from working in the fields in the seventh year. Traditionally in many occupations, a sabbatical is taken in the seventh year of employment and lasts a year. This origin of the word is important, as it emphasizes the primary purpose of the sabbatical, which is taking a break or a rest.

Our *Letter of Agreement* with Fr. Kelly, signed when he joined us in 2003, included a plan for a sabbatical in his sixth year with us. This is a fairly standard arrangement for clergy today. He was to accumulate two weeks for each year of service, to be used in this year, which has come to 12 weeks total for his sabbatical. We will be funding a portion of this, and have had a sabbatical fund since 2004, in which money has been set aside for this purpose. This will give our Rector a very necessary break from the de-

mands of being constantly available for the day-to-day concerns of the parish, and allow him to return fresh and rejuvenated, with new learning and insights. This break from our usual routine will be positive for all of us, giving us new perspectives on our mutual ministry, and allowing us to reunite refreshed and ready to continue the work God had given us to do together.

Note from Father Marshall: As our Senior Warden noted above, a sabbatical is primarily for the purpose of Sabbath Time from parish work, for the purpose of refreshing a priest's ministry. Although all my plans are still tentative, at the beginning and end of the sabbatical I plan a quiet retreat to help myself process the meaning and benefit of this time away. 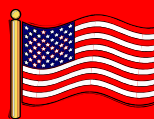

## TOP 10 REASONS TO JOIN THE ST. JAMES' CHOIR

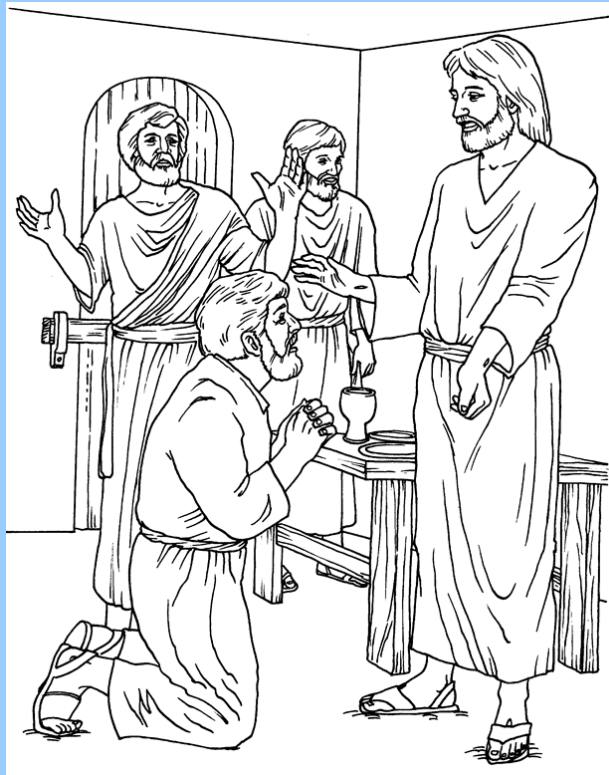
- (1) You are guaranteed a **front row seat!**
