## The Rector's Whatnot: Gearing Up for the Grand Celebration! Father Kelly Marshall

I write this the day after watching the placement of our two new, lovely stained glass windows. I've been consulting with the Memorials Ministry Team from the start on this project. It's downright good to see them at last in their proper settings, in this our Bicentennial Year.

**200 years!** Back in 2007 we began talking about the celebration of our 200th anniversary as an organized congregation within the Episcopal Church. We've been educating ourselves about our roots in Poland, Boardman and Canfield. We've copied and distributed to local research facilities our oldest Parochial Register. We've kept special liturgies to help us focus on our heritage—several in our historic 1828 place of worship at Boardman Park. We were recognized and honored as the oldest parish in the Diocese of Ohio by the 2008 Diocesan Convention. We've worked on several important, timely projects around the building, including the new stained glass windows.

And now, we're just weeks away from the grand celebration of 200 years in ministry. On **Saturday and Sunday, November 21 and 22**, we'll tie together all the loose ends and offer loud praise to the God of our mothers and fathers, "our help in ages past, our hope for years to come." Saturday's events begin with a 5:00 Festival Eucharist at which Bishop Mark Hollingsworth will preside. We'll bless and dedicate the new windows as well as the St. James' Alcove, a lasting memorial to Elton and Christina Beard. And then we'll gather in Jones Hall at 7:00 for the most fabulous Church Potluck you've ever experienced! This is the event to which we are inviting former members and friends, local clergy and congregations, as well as Episcopal clergy and congregations from our own Deanery.

On Sunday morning after all the hoopla, our own parish family will gather for a final time this year at Old St. James, to sing Morning Prayer simply and to say "thank you" to God for the Founding Families. Theirs was the vision in the first decades of the 1800s which continues to energize us today. Our final event of the bicentennial cycle will be a concert on **Sunday, 29 November** (4:00) by the Salem Youth Choir.

Although life goes on week by week in October and early November, **our careful focus now** is to celebrate in good form the bicentennial of the congregation. It will be lots of fun—a once-in-a-life time event for all of us. *Let's do it!*

## STAINED GLASS WINDOWS INSTALLED SEPTEMBER 17

Be sure to visit the Chapel (near the offices), as well as the front entrance, to see the newly-installed stained glass—the first such windows in our nearly 40 years in this building. The window in the Chapel (pictured left) is dedicated to Blessed Mary Magdalene, First of the Apostles and Apostle to the Apostles. It's given by the family of the late Mimi Wilson, in her loving memory. The window in what will soon become the St. James' Alcove opposite the St. Rocco's shrine (pictured right), is dedicated to Blessed James the Apostle, First Martyr among the Apostles and our patron saint. It is a memorial to the late Elton and Christina Beard from their family—as is the entire St. James' Alcove. Both windows will be blessed by Bishop Hollingsworth on November 21 when we celebrate our Bicentennial.

## “When Hospitality Marks the Parish Family . . .”

When I was new at the “priest business,” an older colleague told me this: **“When hospitality marks a parish family, all is well.”** Hospitality is that ancient Christian hallmark which identified followers of Jesus. Some even believed that when hospitality was shown to strangers, angels unwittingly sometimes were entertained. And with proper hospitality comes the joyful sharing food and drink.

*We know how to do this, by and large, here at St. James’ Church.* But a major ministry opportunity before the parish family right now is the need for **a point person, a coordinator**, for our several ministries of welcoming, of sharing food and drink, of hospitality. This person will be the Ministry Coordinator for Parish Life, and will meet monthly with the Rector, Senior Warden and other Ministry Coordinators to think together about the life and mission of our parish family.

Is God calling you to this ministry? If you’ll think and pray about it with me, let me know—we’ll talk!

## YES, WE CAN!!!

...be better stewards of our environment, that is. Thanks to John Frantz for getting us started on an aluminum can recycling program. So far, we have collected 3,375 cans totaling 112-1/2 lbs. At a rate of 40¢ per pound, we raised \$45. That’s a great start toward funding our Outreach ministries. Keep on bringing your aluminum cans and deposit them in the designated receptacles.

## A PIECE OF HISTORY

**H**ave you noticed this lovely needlepoint hanging which graces the area around our baptismal font? I've walked past it more times that I can remember and often wondered who made it. The answer came while searching through some historical documents in preparation for our bicentennial celebration. I came across a Sunday bulletin from Easter Day—April 10, 1977—the day on which this hanging was dedicated. I found the details fascinating and hope that you enjoy reading about it too.

The following is an excerpt from that bulletin:

The design for the hanging was taken from a pattern book published by J. & P. Coats Church Kneelers. It was copied onto Penelope canvas (one that has a double mesh, with two vertical and horizontal threads woven together to form the canvas) by Ernest Polley who spent several hundred hours on the frame. The needlework was done by Jennie Polley, who began the piece in 1975 and finished it in 1976. [The Polleys were members of St. James' Church.]

The needlework was done using nine colors of moth proof pure wools, took approximately 600 hours to complete, and contains around 94,000 stitches. The back is hand-loomed pure silk. The hanging was stretched and finished by Whippell Mowbray Church Furnishing of Cathedral Yard, Exeter, England.

The Latin crosses are the actual form of the cross upon which Jesus died—Crux imissa. The green circle around the center cross is the old form for Omega. The other crosses arranged in a circular pattern denote eternity. The flowers are the roses of the Virgin Mary.

Three circles interlaced is an emblem of the Trinity—God the Fa-



ther, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. The double triangle, the seal of Solomon, represents the perfect God and perfect man. Tongues or flames of fire represent the coming of the Holy Spirit.

The Chi Rho is the earliest monogram of Christ both in Eastern and Western churches and was often combined with other symbols. Here it is used with Alpha and Omega, the beginning and end. They are the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet.

Thanks to the work of Jennie and Ernest Polley for this very special gift to St. James' Church. ∞
